GUIDELINES TO PARENTS

These guidelines are intended to help parents support their child's academic, social, and emotional development in partnership with the school.

Establish Routine - Set a daily routine that includes time for homework, chores, and relaxation. Limit screen time, including TV, computer, and smartphone usage, to ensure a healthy balance.

Encourage Healthy Habits- Promote good nutrition, exercise, and sufficient sleep to support your child's overall well-being. Encourage your child to speak in English at home to enhance language proficiency.

Address Behavioural Issues- Work with teachers to address any behavioural concerns and support your child in developing positive behaviour.

Promote Respect and Kindness- Teach your child the importance of respect, kindness, and empathy towards others.

Stay Informed - Stay informed about school policies, events, and your child's progress by regularly checking school communications and portals. You may meet the Principal and teachers during the visiting hours (3:30 pm - 4:30pm). Meeting with prior appointment will be appreciated as they have to make themselves free to address your concerns.

Encourage Independence- Support your child in becoming independent and responsible for their own actions and decisions.

Stationary and Uniform

- * Purchase Age-Appropriate Materials: Ensure all items are suitable for your child's age and educational needs.
- * Daily Necessities Only: Children should only carry what they need for each school day. Unnecessary items should be left at home.
- * Whiteners: Absolutely no whiteners are allowed.
- * Stationery: Avoid purchasing fancy pencils, pens, and erasers, be cautious while choosing erasers; avoid colorful or scented ones.

G. Shankara Kurup

G. Shankara Kurup was born on June 3, 1901, at Nayathode, also referred to as Mahakavi G, was an Indian poet, essayist and literary critic of Malayalam literature. Known as one of the greats of Malayalam poetry, he was the first recipient of the Jnanpith Award-the highest Indian literary honor. He joined Maharajas College, Ernakulam as a lecturer where he stayed until his retirement from service as a professor in 1956. He also served as a producer at the Thiruvananthapuram station of the All India Radio.



Pichai Sundararajan

Pichai Sundararajan was born on June 10, 1972 better known as Sundar Pichai is an Indian-born American business executive. He is the chief executive officer (CEO) of Alphabet Inc. and its subsidiary Google. Pichai was born in Madurai, Tamil Nadu, India, to a Tamil family. His mother, Lakshmi, was a stenographer, and his father, Regunatha Pichai, was an electrical engineer at GEC, the British conglomerate. In 2022, Pichai received the Padma Bhushan in the category of Trade and Industry from the Government of India, the country's third-highest civilian award.



Annelies Marie Frank

Annelies Marie Frank was a German-born Jewish girl who kept a diary in which she documented life in hiding under Nazi persecution during the German occupation of the Netherlands. She is a celebrated diarist who described everyday life from her family hiding place in an Amsterdam attic. One of the most-discussed Jewish victims of the Holocaust, she gained fame posthumously with the 1947 publication of 'The Diary of a Young Girl', in which she documents her life in hiding from 1942 to 1944.



Helen Adams Keller

Helen Adams Keller was an American author, disability rights advocate, political activist and lecturer. She was born in West Tusculum, Alabama. She lost her sight and hearing after a bout of illness when she was 19 months old. She then communicated primarily using home signs until the age of seven, when she met her first teacher and life-long companion Anne Sullivan. Sullivan taught Keller language, including reading and writing. After the education at both specialist and mainstream schools, Keller attended Radcliffe College of Harvard University and became the first deaf blind person in the United States to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree. On September 14, 1964, President Lyndon B. Johnson awarded her the Presidential Medal of Freedom, one of the United States' two highest civilian honors. In 1965 she was elected to the National Women's Hall of Fame at the New York World's Fair.



Pilavullakandi Thekkeparambil Usha

P.T. Usha was born on 27 June 1964 is an Indian sports administrator and retired track and field athlete. Usha was born in Koothali near Perambra in Kozhikode district, Kerala. She grew up in Payyoli. Usha has been associated with Indian athletics since 1979. She has won 4 gold medals and 7 silver medals in the Asian Games. She is often associated as the "Queen of Indian track and field". She received Padma Shri in 1985

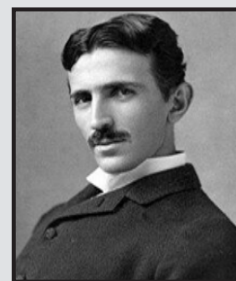

PERSONALITIES OF THE MONTH - JULY

Nikola Tesla

Nikola Tesla was a Serbian-American inventor, electrical engineer, mechanical engineer, and futurist. He is known for his contributions to the design of the modern alternating current (AC) electricity supply system. In 1884 he emigrated to the United States, where he became a naturalized citizen. Tesla conducted a range of experiments with mechanical oscillators/generators, electrical discharge tubes, and early X-ray imaging. He also built a wirelessly controlled boat, one of the first ever exhibited. Tesla became well known as an inventor and demonstrated his achievements to celebrities and wealthy patrons at his lab, and was noted for his showmanship at public lectures.



Malala Yousafzai

Malala Yousafzai was born on 12 July 1997, is a Pakistani female education activist and the 2014 Nobel Peace Prize laureate at the age of 17. She is the youngest Nobel Prize laureate in history, the second Pakistani to receive a Nobel Prize. Yousafzai is a human rights advocate for the education of women and children in her native homeland, Swat, where the Pakistani Taliban had banned girls from attending school. Her advocacy has grown into an international movement and she has become Pakistan's "most prominent citizen."



Shiv Nadar

Shiv Nadar was born on 14 July 1945. He is an Indian billionaire businessman and philanthropist. He was the founder and chairman of HCL Technologies, and is chairman of the Shiv Nadar Foundation. Nadar founded HCL in the mid-1970s and transformed the IT hardware company into an IT enterprise over the next three decades. In 2008, Nadar was awarded Padma Bhushan for his efforts in the IT industry. Nadar, nicknamed by friends as Magus (Old Persian for "wizard"), since the mid-1990s he has focused his efforts on developing the educational system of India through the Shiv Nadar Foundation. According to Forbes, he is the 3rd richest person in India and the 30th richest person in the world with an estimated net worth of US\$40 billion as of February 2024.



Madan Thekkepaattu Vasudevan Nair

M.T. Vasudevan Nair was born on 15 July 1933, popularly known as M.T., is an Indian author, screenplay writer and film director. He is a prolific and versatile writer in modern Malayalam literature, and is one of the masters of post-Independence Indian literature. He is well known to be the writer of the Nila. At the age of 20, as a chemistry undergraduate, he won the prize for the best short story in Malayalam at World Short Story Competition conducted by The New York Herald Tribune.



George Bernard Shaw

George Bernard Shaw was born on 26 July 1856 known at his insistence as Bernard Shaw, was an Irish playwright, critic, polemicist and political activist. He wrote more than sixty plays, including major works such as Man and Superman, Pygmalion and Saint Joan. With a range incorporating both contemporary satire and historical allegory, Shaw became the leading dramatist of his generation, and in 1925 was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature.

Damodar Mauzo

Damodar Mauzo was born on 1st August 1944, is an Indian short story writer, novelist, critic and script writer in Konkani. He was awarded the 57th Jnanpith Award, India's highest literary honour, in 2022, Sahitya Akademi Award in 1983 for his novel Karmelin and the Vimala V. Pai Vishwa Konkani Sahitya Puraskar award for his novel Tsunami Simon in 2011. His collection of short stories Teresa's Man and other stories from Goa was nominated for the Frank O'Connor International award in 2015. He has served as a member of the executive board, general council, as well as the finance committee of the Sahitya Akademi.



Mankombu Sambasivan Swaminathan

M.S. Swaminathan was an Indian agronomist, agricultural scientist, geneticist, administrator and humanitarian. Swaminathan's collaborative scientific efforts with Norman Borlaug, spearheading a mass movement with farmers and other scientists and backed by public policies, saved India and Pakistan from certain famine-like conditions in the 1960s. His leadership as director general of the International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) in the Philippines was instrumental in his being awarded the first World Food Prize in 1987, recognized as one of the highest honours in the field of agriculture. The United Nations Environment Programme has called him "the Father of Economic Ecology". He was recently conferred the Bharat Ratna, the highest civilian award of the Republic of India, in 2024.



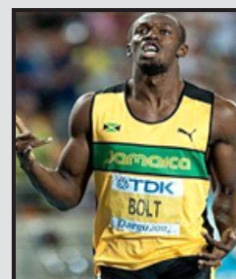
Barack Hussein Obama II

Barack Obama was born on August 4, 1961, is an American politician who served as the 44th President of the United States from 2009 to 2017. A member of the Democratic Party, he was the first African-American president in U.S. history. Obama previously served as a U.S. senator representing Illinois from 2005 to 2008, as an Illinois state senator from 1997 to 2004, and as a community service organizer, civil rights lawyer, and university lecturer.



Usain St. Leo Bolt

Usain Bolt was born on 21 August 1986. He is the world record holder in the 100 metres, 200 metres, and 4 × 100 metres relay. An eight-time Olympic gold medallist, Bolt is the only sprinter to win Olympic 100 m and 200 m titles at three consecutive Olympics (2008, 2012, and 2016). He also won two 4 × 100 relay gold medals. He gained worldwide fame for his double sprint victory in world record times at the 2008 Beijing Olympics. His achievements as a sprinter have earned him the media nickname "Lightning Bolt", and his awards include the IAAF World Athlete of the Year, BBC Overseas Sports Personality of the Year (three times), and Laureus World Sportsman of the Year.



Michael Joseph Jackson

Michael Joseph Jackson was an American singer, songwriter, dancer, and philanthropist who was known as the "King of Pop". During his four-decade career, his contributions to music, dance, and fashion, along with his publicized personal life, made him a global figure in popular culture. Jackson influenced artists across many music genres. Through stage and video performances, he popularized complicated street dance moves such as the moonwalk, which he named, as well as the robot during the 20th century.

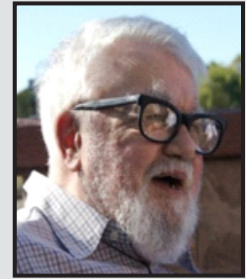

John McCarthy

John McCarthy was born on September 4, 1927. He was an American computer scientist and cognitive scientist. He was one of the founders of the discipline of artificial intelligence. He co-authored the document that coined the term "artificial intelligence" (AI), developed the programming language family Lisp, significantly influenced the design of the language ALGOL, popularized time-sharing, and invented garbage collection. McCarthy spent most of his career at Stanford University. He received many accolades and honors, such as the 1971 Turing Award for his contributions to the topic of AI, the United States National Medal of Science, and the Kyoto Prize.



Jack Ma Yun

Jack Ma Yun was born on September 10, 1964, Hangzhou. He is a Chinese business magnate, investor and philanthropist. He is the co-founder of Alibaba Group, a multinational technology conglomerate. In addition, Ma is also the co-founder of Yunfeng Capital, a Chinese private equity firm. The key to his success lay in the productivity of his team. Jack Ma's success is rooted in his visionary thinking. Jack Ma's story is a testament to the power of resilience and perseverance.



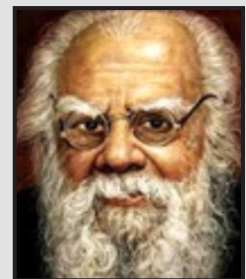
Lev Nikolayevich Tolstoy

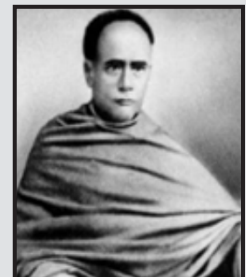
Erode Venkatappa Ramasamy

Ishwar Chandra Bandyopadhyay popularly known as Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar was born on 26 September 1820. He was an Indian educator and social reformer of the nineteenth century. His efforts to simplify and modernise Bengali prose were significant. He also rationalised and simplified the Bengali alphabet and type, which had remained unchanged since Charles Wilkins and Panchanan Karmakar had cut the first Bengali type in 1780.

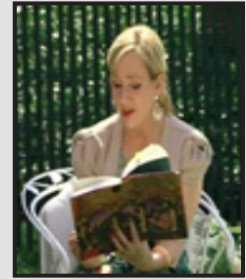

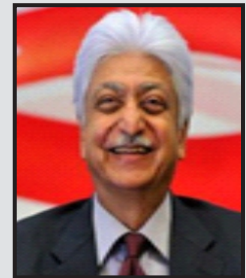
Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela

He is informally known as the Czar of the Indian IT Industry. He was responsible for guiding Wipro through four decades of diversification and growth, to finally emerge as one of the global leaders in the software industry. In 2010, he was voted among the 20 most powerful men in the world by Asia week.



Theodore Roosevelt Jr.

Theodore Roosevelt Jr., often referred to as Teddy or by his initials, T.R., was born on October 27, 1858, New York, was an American politician, statesman, conservationist, naturalist, and writer who served as the 26th president of the United States from 1901 to 1909. Roosevelt expanded the Navy and sent the Great White Fleet on a world tour to project American naval power. His successful efforts to broker the end of the Russo- Japanese War won him the 1906 Nobel Peace Prize, making him the first American to ever win a Nobel Prize.



William Henry Gates III

Bill Gates was born on October 28, 1955 is an American businessman, investor, philanthropist, and writer best known for co-founding the software giant Microsoft, along with his childhood friend Paul Allen. During his career at Microsoft, Gates held the positions of chairman, chief executive officer (CEO), president, and chief software architect, while also being its largest individual shareholder until May 2014. He was a pioneer of the microcomputer revolution of the 1970s and 1980s.

Shakuntala Devi

Shakuntala Devi was a charismatic lady from India who was recognized for her exceptional calculating speed. For this reason, she got the title of the 'human computer.' She was born in 1929 in Bangalore. Her journey was a bit different from other famous Indian mathematicians. Shakuntala Devi, a mathematician, started her journey from memorizing cards for the show in the circuses to getting her name into the Guinness Book of World Record. This Indian mathematician's biography inspires and elates the motivation of everyone who thrives to do wonders as a mathematician.



Lakshmibai

Lakshmibai Newalkar, the Rani of Jhansi was born on 19 November 1828. She was the Maharani consort of the princely state of Jhansi in Maratha Empire from 1843 to 1853 by marriage to Maharaja Gangadhar Rao Newalkar. She was one of the leading figures in the Indian Rebellion of 1857, who became a national hero and symbol of resistance to the British rule in India for Indian nationalists. The Rani of Jhansi Regiment remains an important symbol of women's participation in the struggle for Indian independence, and its legacy has inspired generations of women in India and beyond. The Indian Coast Guard ship ICGS Lakshmi Bai has been named after her.



Mary Kom

Mangte Chungneijang Mary Kom was born on 24 November 1982. She is an Indian Olympic boxer, politician, and former Member of Rajya Sabha. She is the only woman to win the World Amateur Boxing Championship six times. Nicknamed Magnificent Mary. She became the first Indian female boxer to win a gold medal in the Asian Games in 2014 at Incheon, South Korea and is the first Indian female boxer to win gold at the 2018 Commonwealth Games. Mary Kom won the 51 kg gold in the President's Cup in Indonesia. She has received Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan, Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna award, Padma Shri, Arjuna Award.



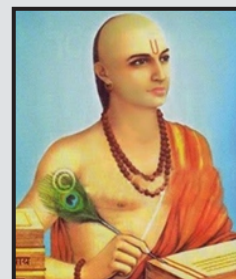
Kalidasa

Kalidasa (4th–5th century CE) was a Classical Sanskrit author who is often considered ancient India's greatest poet and playwright. His plays and poetry are primarily based on Hindu Puranas and philosophy. His surviving works consist of three plays, two epic poems and two shorter poems which were translated to many languages. Mithali Dorai Raj

Mithali Raj was born on 3 December 1982, is an Indian former cricketer and was captain of the India women's national cricket team from 2004 to 2022. She is the highest run-scorer in women's international cricket, and ESPN ranked her as one of the greatest female cricketers of all time. Raj has received several national and international awards, including the Wisden Leading Woman Cricketer in the World in 2017, Arjuna Award in 2003, the Padma Shri in 2015, and Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna in 2021. She is the only female cricketer to surpass the 7,000-run mark in Women's One Day International (WODI) matches. She is the first player to score seven consecutive 50s in ODIs. She also holds the record for most half-centuries in WODIs.



Viswanathan Anand

Viswanathan Anand was born on 11 December 1969, is an Indian chess grandmaster, a former five-time World Chess Champion and a record two-time Chess World Cup Champion. He became the first grandmaster from India in 1988, and he has the eighth-highest peak FIDE rating of all time. In 2022, he was elected the deputy president of FIDE. Known for his rapid playing speed as a child, Anand earned the sobriquet "Lightning Kid", during his early career in the 1980s. Anand was the first recipient of the Khel Ratna Award in 1991–92, India's highest sporting honour. In 2007, he was awarded India's second-highest civilian award, the Padma Vibhushan, making him the first sports person to receive the award.



Subramania Bharati

Bharati was a Tamil writer, poet, journalist, Indian independence activist, social reformer and polyglot. He was bestowed the title "Bharati" for his excellence in poetry. He was a pioneer of modern Tamil poetry and is considered one of the greatest Tamil literary figures of all time. He is popularly known by his mononymous title "Bharati/ Bharathiyaar," and also by the other title "Mahakavi Bharati" ("the great poet Bharati"). His numerous works included fiery songs kindling patriotism during the Indian Independence movement. He fought for the emancipation of women, against child marriage, vehemently opposed the caste system, and stood for reforming society and religion. He was also in solidarity with Dalits.



Srinivasa Ramanujan

Ramanujan was born on 22 December 1887 who was an Indian mathematician. Though he had almost no formal training in pure mathematics, he made substantial contributions to mathematical analysis, number theory, infinite series, and continued fractions. During his short life, Ramanujan independently compiled nearly 3,900 results (mostly identities and equations).



Ratan Naval Tata

Ratan Naval Tata was born on 28 December 1937 is an Indian industrialist, philanthropist and former chairman of Tata Sons. He was a chairman of the Tata Group from 1990 to 2012, and interim chairman from October 2016 through February 2017. He continues to head its charitable trusts. Ratan Tata received the Padma Bhushan in 2000 and Padma Vibhushan in 2008, the third and second highest civilian honours awarded by the Government of India. Tata has also received various state civilian honours like Maharashtra Bhushan in 2006 for his huge work in the public administration in Maharashtra and 'Assam Baibhav' in 2021 for his exceptional contribution towards furthering cancer care in Assam.

Satyendra Nath Bose

S.N.Bose, famously known for Bose-Einstein Condensate, is among the top 10 mathematicians of India. Satyendra Nath Bose was an Indian mathematician and physicist who worked with Albert Einstein on the Bose-Einstein Condensate project. Among the Indian mathematicians' names, Bose is one such who was felicitated with Padma Vibhushan. Bose is also referred to as the 'Father of the God Particles' for his contribution to the Boson particle. The Boson particle is also known as the God particle.



Rowan Sebastian Atkinson

Mr. Bean was born on 6 January 1955, is an English actor, comedian and writer. He played the title roles in the sitcoms Blackadder (1983–1989) and Mr. Bean (1990–1995), and in the film series Johnny English (2003–2018). Atkinson first came to prominence on the BBC sketch comedy show Not the Nine O' Clock News (1979–1982), receiving the 1981 British Academy Television Award for Best Entertainment Performance.



Stephen William Hawking

Stephen Hawking was born on 8 January 1942. He was an English theoretical physicist, cosmologist, and author who was director of research at the Centre for Theoretical Cosmology at the University of Cambridge. Between 1979 and 2009, he was the Lucasian Professor of Mathematics at Cambridge, widely viewed as one of the most prestigious academic posts in the world. He worked on the physics of black holes. He proposed that black holes would emit subatomic particles until they eventually exploded.



Kailash Satyarthi

Kailash Satyarthi was born on 11 January 1954. He is an Indian social reformer who campaigned against child labor in India and advocated the universal right to education. In 2014, he was the co-recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize, along with Malala Yousafzai, 'for their struggle against the suppression of children and young people and for the right of all children to education'. He is the founder of multiple social activist organizations, including Bachpan Bachao Andolan, Global March Against Child Labour, Global Campaign for Education, Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation, and Bal Ashram Trust.



Martin Luther King Jr.

Martin Luther King Jr. was born on January 15, 1929. He was an American Christian minister, activist, and political philosopher who was one of the most prominent leaders in the civil rights movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968. A black church leader and a son of early civil rights activist and minister Martin Luther King Sr., King advanced civil rights for people of colour in the United States through the use of non-violent resistance and non-violent civil disobedience against Jim Crow laws and other forms of legalized discrimination. King became the youngest winner of the Nobel Peace Prize.

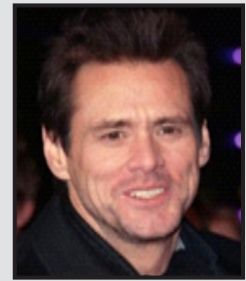

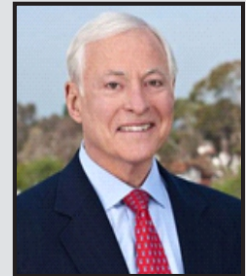
Jim Carrey

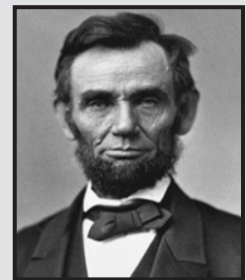
Brian Tracy

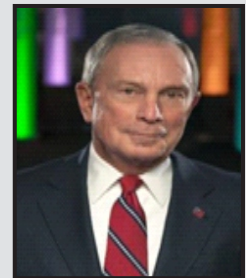
Abraham Lincoln

He was a pioneer of the personal computer revolution of the 1970s and 1980s, along with his early business partner and fellow Apple co-founder Steve Wozniak. He and Wozniak co-founded Apple in 1976 to further develop and sell Wozniak's Apple I personal computer. Together, the duo gained fame and wealth a year later with production and sale of the Apple II, one of the first highly successful mass-produced microcomputers.

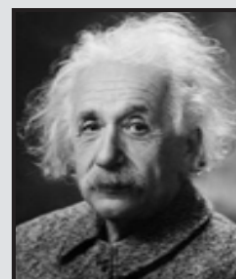
Aryabhata

Aryabhata I (476–550 CE) was the first of the major Mathematician-astronomers from the classical age of Indian mathematics and Indian astronomy. His works include the Aryabhatiya and the Arya-siddhanta. For his explicit mention of the relativity of motion, he also qualifies as a major early physicist. He discovered 'zero'. In addition, he was the first to compute the value of 'pi' to the fourth decimal point with precision. He was the one who came up with the formula for computing the areas of triangles and circles.



Albert Einstein

Albert Einstein was born on 14 March 1879, was a German-born theoretical physicist who is widely held to be one of the greatest and most influential scientists of all time. Best known for developing the theory of relativity, Einstein also made important contributions to quantum mechanics, and was thus a central figure in the revolutionary reshaping of the scientific understanding of nature that modern physics accomplished in the first decades of the twentieth century. His mass–energy equivalence formula $E = mc^2$, which arises from relativity theory, has been called “the world's most famous equation”. He received the 1921 Nobel Prize in Physics “for his services to theoretical physics, and especially for his discovery of the law of the photoelectric effect”, a pivotal step in the development of quantum theory. His work is also known for its influence on the philosophy of science. In a 1999 poll of 130 leading physicists worldwide by the British journal Physics World, Einstein was ranked the greatest physicist of all time. His intellectual achievements and originality have made the word Einstein broadly synonymous with genius.



Kalpana Chawla

Kalpana Chawla was an Indian-born American astronaut and aerospace engineer who was the first woman of Indian origin to fly to space. She first flew on Space Shuttle Columbia in 1997 as a mission specialist and primary robotic arm operator aboard STS- 87. In 2003, Kalpana Chawla was one of the seven crew members killed in the Space Shuttle Columbia disaster. She was posthumously awarded, awards like Congressional Space Medal of Honor, NASA Space Flight Medal, and NASA Distinguished Service Medal.



Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw

Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw is an Indian billionaire entrepreneur. She is the executive chairperson and founder of Biocon Limited and Biocon Biologics Limited, a biotechnology company based in Bangalore, India and the former chairperson of Indian Institute of Management, Bangalore. In 2014, she was awarded the Othmer Gold Medal for outstanding contributions to the progress of science and chemistry. She was on the Financial Times 2011 top 50 women in business list. In 2019, she was listed as the 68th most powerful woman in the world by Forbes. She was named as World Entrepreneur of the Year 2020.



Kamala Das

Kamala Surayya was born on 31 March 1934 – 31 May 2009, popularly known by her one-time pen name Madhavikutty and married name Kamala Das, was an Indian poet in English as well as an author in Malayalam from Kerala, India. Her fame in Kerala primarily stems from her short stories and autobiography, My Story, whereas her body of work in English, penned under the pseudonym Kamala Das, is renowned for its poems and candid autobiography. She was also a widely read columnist and wrote on diverse topics including women's issues, child care, politics, etc. Her liberal treatment of female sexuality, marked her as an iconoclast in popular culture of her generation.

Oprah Winfrey

Oprah Gail Winfrey was born on January 29, 1954. She is an American talk show host, television producer, actress, author, and media proprietor. She is best known for her talk show, *The Oprah Winfrey Show*. Winfrey popularised and revolutionised the tabloid talk show genre pioneered by Phil Donahue. By the mid-1990s, Winfrey had reinvented her talk show with a focus on literature, self-improvement, mindfulness and spirituality. Ventured forth from the agonizing childhood, that was her world of common day, to a region of supernatural wonder. Oprah's road to success was not an easy task. From her early childhood, Oprah challenged many fabulous forces that she encountered. Oprah Winfrey tells the life story of one of America's richest and most successful show business personalities. She has received honorary doctorate degrees from multiple universities.



Sachin Tendulkar

Sachin Tendulkar was born on 24 April 1973 is an Indian former international cricketer who captained the Indian national team. He is widely regarded as one of the greatest batsmen in the history of cricket. Hailed as the world's most prolific batsman of all time, he is the all-time highest run-scorer in both ODI and Test cricket with more than 18,000 runs and 15,000 runs, respectively. He also holds the record for receiving the most player of the match awards in international cricket. Tendulkar was a Member of Parliament, Rajya Sabha by presidential nomination from 2012 to 2018. He has received Arjuna Award, by the Government of India in recognition of his outstanding achievement in sports. He received awards like, Khel Ratna Award, Padma Shri, Maharashtra Bhushan Award, Padma Vibhushan, and Bharat Ratna.



Sir Charles Spencer Chaplin

Charlie Chaplin was an English comic actor, filmmaker, and composer who rose to fame in the era of silent film. He became a worldwide icon through his screen persona, the Tramp, and is considered one of the film industry's most important figures. Chaplin received many awards and honours, especially later in life. In the 1975 New Year Honours, he was also awarded Honorary Doctor of Letters degrees by the University of Oxford and the University of Durham in 1962. In 1965, he and Ingmar Bergman were joint winners of the Erasmus Prize. Chaplin received a special Golden Lion at the Venice Film Festival in 1972 and a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Lincoln Center Film Society the same year. Chaplin received three Academy Awards: two Honorary Awards and a Best Score award.



Nathaniel Branden

Nathaniel Branden was born on 9 April 1930, Brampton, Canada. He was a Canadian – American psychotherapist and writer known for his work in the psychology of self-esteem. A former associate and romantic partner of Ayn Rand, Branden also played a prominent role in the 1960s in promoting Rand's philosophy, Objectivism. He is the father of the concept of self-esteem, and has an expanded two-fold definition of self-esteem.



Mark Elliot Zuckerberg

Mark Zuckerberg was born May 14, 1984 is an American businessman and philanthropist. He co-founded the social media service Facebook, along with his Harvard roommates in 2004, and its parent company Meta Platforms (formerly Facebook, Inc.), of which he is chairman, chief executive officer and controlling shareholder.

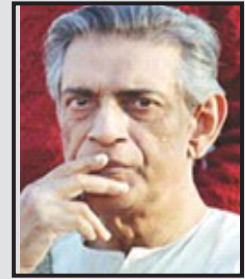

PERSONALITIES OF THE MONTH - MAY

Satyajit Ray

Satyajit Ray was an Indian director, screenwriter, documentary filmmaker, author, essayist, lyricist, magazine editor, illustrator, calligrapher, and composer. Ray is widely considered one of the greatest and most influential film directors in the history of cinema. He is celebrated for works including *The Apu Trilogy* (1955–1959), *The Music Room* (1958), *The Big City* (1963) and *Charulata* (1964) and the *Goopy-Bagha* trilogy. He was awarded the Dadasaheb Phalke Award in 1985, and the Legion of Honor by the President of France in 1987. The Government of India awarded him the Padma Bhushan in 1965 and the highest civilian honour, Bharat Ratna, shortly before his death. The Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences awarded Rayan Honorary Award in 1992 for Lifetime Achievement. In 1992, he was posthumously awarded the Akira Kurosawa Award.



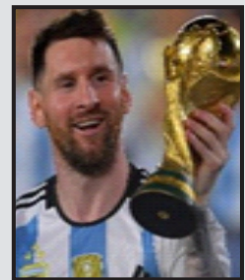
Thiruvalluvar

Thiruvalluvar, commonly known as Valluvar, was an Indian poet and philosopher. He is best known as the author of the *Tirukkural*, a collection of couplets on ethics, political and economic matters, and love. The text is considered an exceptional and widely cherished work of Tamil literature. Despite Thiruvalluvar's reasonable tone, many of his ideas were revolutionary. He dismissed the caste system: "One is not great because of one's birth in a noble family; one is not low because of one's low birth." The poet maintained that goodness is its own reward and should not be regarded as a mere means to a comfortable afterlife.



Lionel Andrés Messi

Lionel Messi was born 24 June 1987 is an Argentine professional footballer who plays as a forward for and captains both Major League Soccer club Inter Miami and the Argentina national team. Widely regarded as one of the greatest players of all time, Messi has won a record eight Ballon d'Or awards, a record six European Golden Shoes, and was named the world's best player for a record eight times by FIFA. Naturally left-footed, quick, and precise in control of the ball, Messi is known as a keen pass distributor and can readily thread his way through packed defenses.



Mahendra Singh Dhoni

Mahendra Singh Dhoni was born on 7 July 1981 is an Indian professional cricketer. He is a right handed batter and a wicket-keeper. Dhoni has captained the most international matches and is the most successful Indian captain. He has led India to victory in the 2011 Cricket World Cup, the 2007 ICC World Twenty20 and the 2013 ICC Champions Trophy, the only captain to win three different limited overs tournaments. He also led the teams that won the Asia Cup in 2010, 2016 and was a member of the title winning squad in 2018. Dhoni effortlessly emits two qualities: Confidence and Self-belief.



Allah Rakha Rahman

A.R. Rahman is an Indian music composer, record producer, singer, songwriter, musician, multi-instrumentalist and philanthropist, popular for his works in Indian cinema; predominantly in Tamil and Hindi films, with occasional forays in international cinema. He is a winner of six National Film Awards, two Academy Awards, two Grammy Awards, a BAFTA Award, a Golden Globe Award, fifteen Filmfare Awards and seventeen Filmfare Awards South. In 2010, the Indian government conferred him with the Padma Bhushan, the nation's third-highest civilian award.
